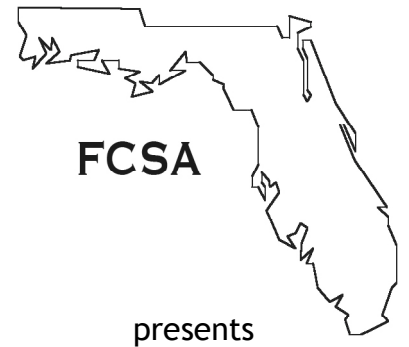

## SEMINAR DIRECTIONS

University of Miami, DTC Pavilion at  
Jackson Memorial Hospital

### From the North:

Exit I-95 onto SR-836 W. Stay in right lane & take first exit (14th St.). Stay west on 14th St. to 12th Ave. Second light is Park Plaza West Parking Garage. At 19th St. is the main entrance to Jackson Memorial Hospital and the Diagnostic Treatment Center.

### From the South:

Exit I-95 onto SR-836 W. Move to the right lane to exit for 12th Ave. Turn right from the exit ramp onto 12th Ave. Continue north one block. Second light is Park Plaza West Parking Garage. At 19th St. is the main entrance to Jackson Memorial Hospital and the Diagnostic Treatment Center.

### From the Dolphin Expressway:

Take SR-836 E. Exit at N.W. 17th Ave. heading north to the Civic Center/Hospitals. On the exit ramp bear left & turn right onto 17th Ave. Cross the bridge & turn right at first traffic light onto N. River Drive. Make first left onto N.W. 13th Terrace. Turn right on N.W. 12th Ave. Second light is Park Plaza West Parking Garage. At 19th St. is the main entrance to Jackson Memorial Hospital and the Diagnostic Treatment Center.

### Arriving via Metrorail:

Take Civic Center Station exit onto N.W. 12th Ave. Entrance to Jackson Memorial Hospital is just north of the station on the east side of N.W. 12th Ave.

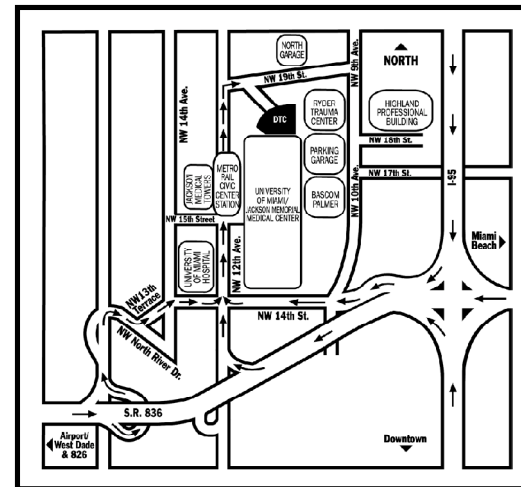
